

# Report Onsite Caribbean 2 Seminar and Planning Meeting May 25-26, 2009, Guyana

## **Introduction and Background**

Caribbean Export Development Agency (Caribbean Export), in collaboration with TFO Canada and under the ambit of the Caribbean Design Network (CDN), is seeking to build on the successes of the original Onsite Caribbean Project by creating and implementing a second phase of the project Onsite Caribbean 2. It is anticipated that the Caribbean Development Bank will also be associated with Onsite Caribbean 2. The original Onsite Caribbean supported product and market development (directed primarily at the Canadian market) for seven artisan producers in the gift and craft sector from Barbados, Dominica, Haiti and Jamaica.

### **Project Objective**

The general objective of the project is to increase the competitiveness of micro and small sized enterprises in the region through the development of export ready craft collections and the launch and promotion of these collections in regional and international markets. A single coordinated project that brings to bear the specialized skills of all the participants should create a transferable methodology for working with micro, small and medium-sized enterprises (MSME) regionally.

# The specific objectives are:

- To develop, under the aegis of a regional design team and international experts, a combined export-ready product collection that is both contemporary, and, reflective of the history and specialized skills of the region.
- To strengthen the capacity of the group and/or cluster for export. The focus of the
  work will be production specialization for companies, the creation of marketadapted designs and quality product and/or process innovation, the promotion of
  joint design process through creative workshops, and, to provide access to
  external markets, specifically a product launch at Maison et Objet in January
  2010.
- To work in coordination with the re-branded Caribbean Gift and Craft Show to showcase these new product collections

# **Report**

The first seminar and planning activity for Onsite Caribbean 2 was held in Guyana, over the period May 25-26. Ten participants (comprising 5 members of the proposed regional design team and 3 other persons - See Appendix 1) along with Caribbean Export's Manager Core Services and TFO Canada Associate Patty Johnson attended the meeting.

The meeting objectives were to: Review the original Onsite Caribbean companies and undertake assessment of new companies for inclusion in the project; Evaluation and analysis of benchmarking, design input and deficits, ecological aspects, potential for market re-entry and creation of new markets in the region; and, the development of a 6 to 7 month work plan for the project. These objectives were all achieved and the detailed work plan is attached at Appendix 11 to this report.

Other important decisions of the meeting are summarized below:

- The regional design team will oversee product development in Bahamas, Haiti, Dominica, St. Vincent, St. Lucia, Trinidad and Tobago, Jamaica and Barbados. TFO Associate Patty Johnson will supervise this coordinated effort while working concurrently on pending national product development projects in Barbados, Jamaica and Guyana. In addition, Patty Johnson will review companies identified in Belize and Suriname. (See Appendix 111 for list of companies)
- The group will meet in the Caribbean for three more 2 or 3 day sessions between June and December 2009 to review research, analyse data and develop the new product collection. In order to facilitate this process, the group developed a research information template. These templates will be used to create a documentary record of this activity, to develop a short list of companies that will be included in Onsite Caribbean Two, and, to assist with communication between the members of the network via email and the Internet.
- The design team will also make a study visit to Maison et Objet in September 2009 and will participate in the planning and implementation of the launch at the same trade show in January 2010.
